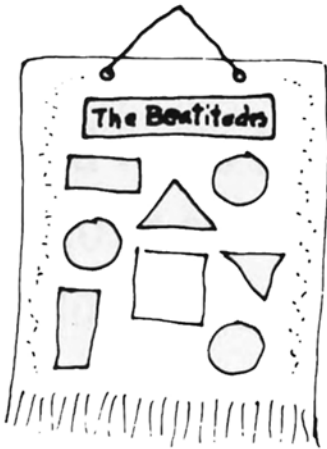

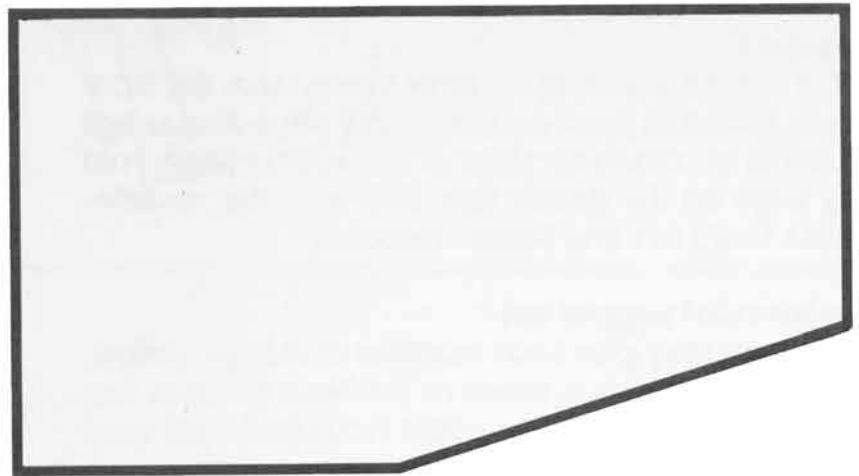

Enrichment suggestions:

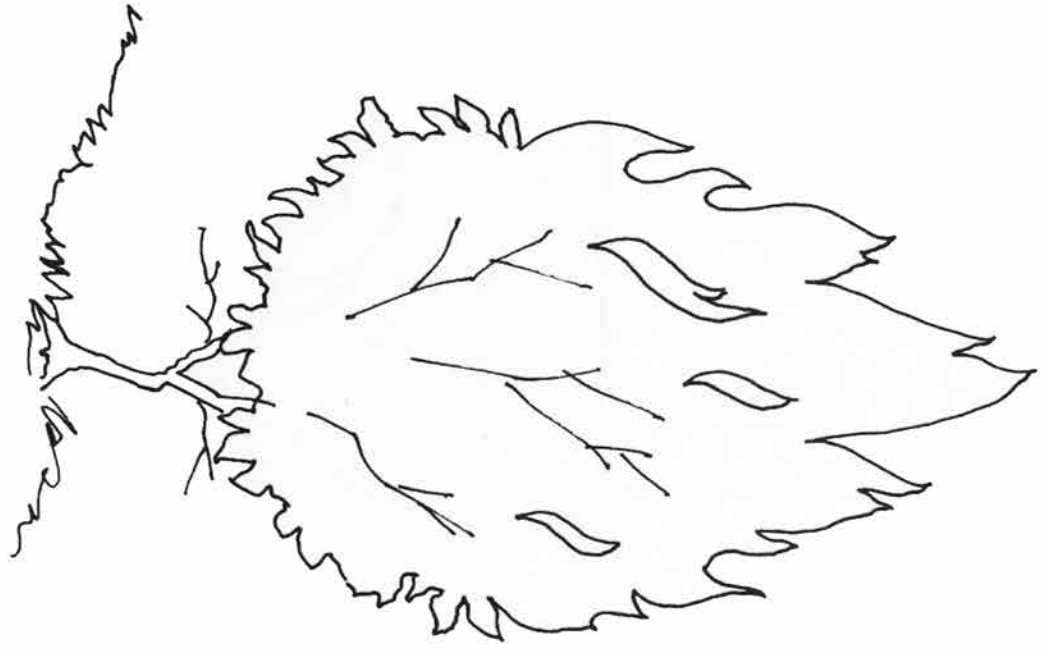
Children may cut out the Beatitudes and the shapes and glue them onto a sheet of construction paper. Cut fringes on the bottom edge. Decorate with glitter.

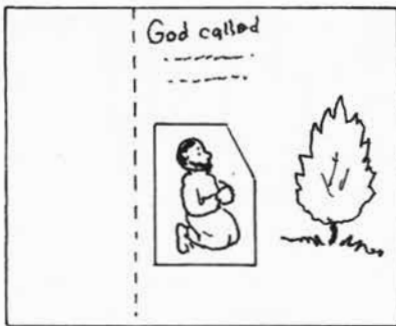
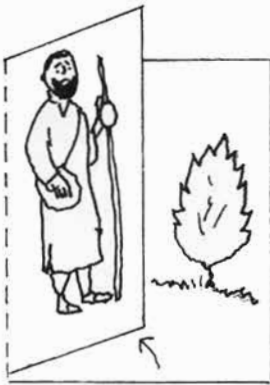
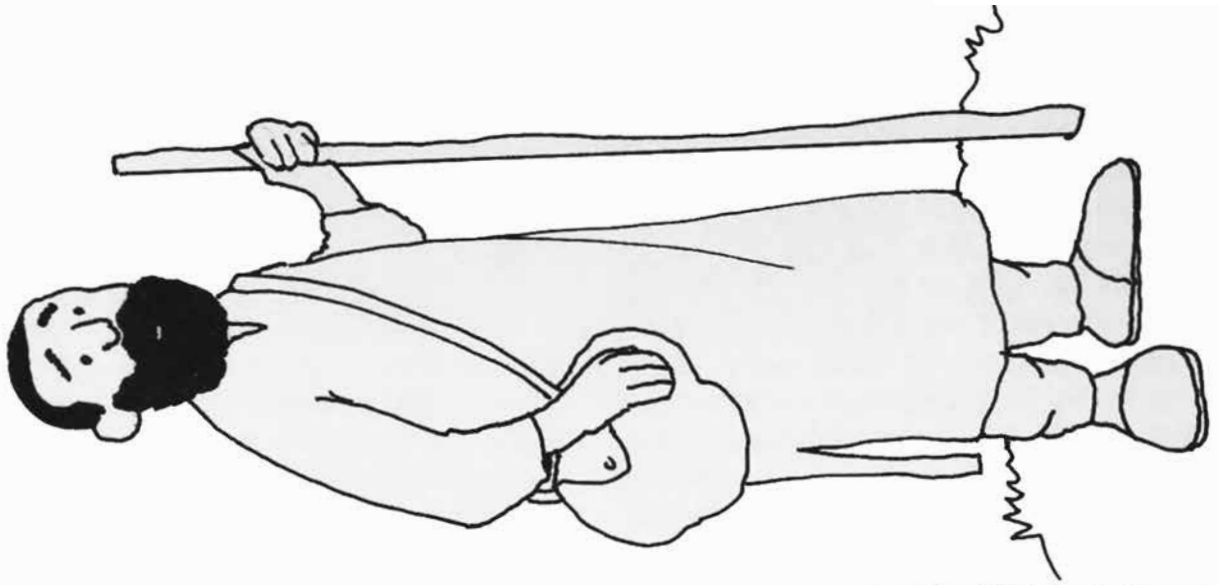

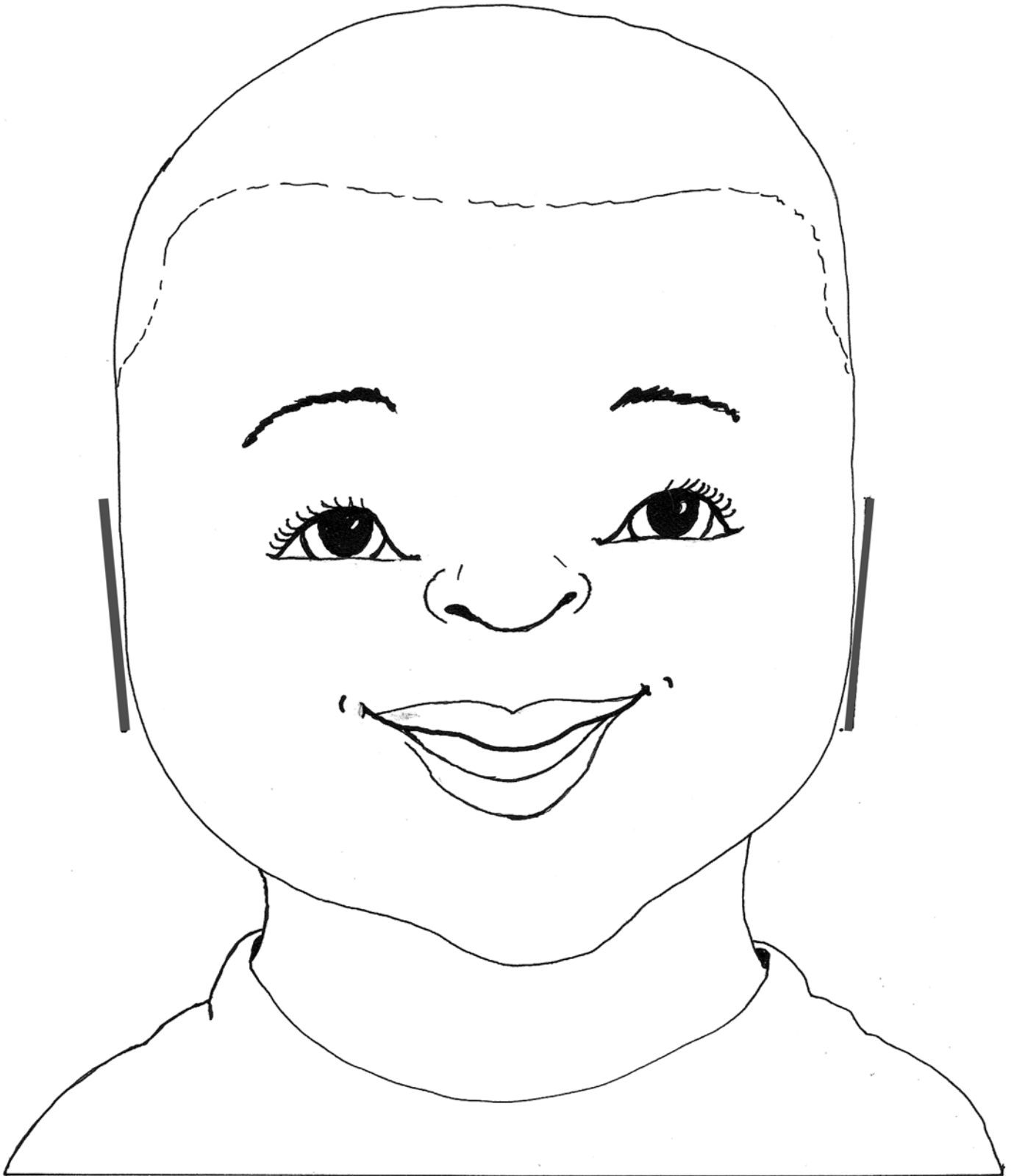


Craft 2

Cut out the kneeling figure of Moses from the front cover. Glue it in place on the activity page. Encourage students to color both sides of the activity page. Fold the page on the dotted line. Talk with the students about god's call and Moses' response.

Enrichment suggestions:

Students may glue small triangles of orange, yellow, and red construction paper to the bush to show fire. What kind of happening might God use to get your attention?

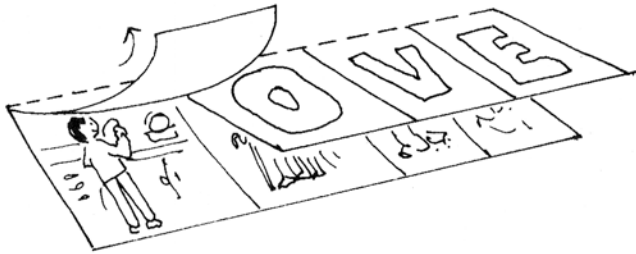
Make a face with ears to listen. Children may color the face. The girls may wish to draw more hair and beads. Cut out the ears from the front cover and glue them in place on the head. Remind the children to listen when God's Word is read so they will know what Jesus wants them to do.

Enrichment suggestions:

Students may wish to write a Bible verse about listening to God on the page. Examples are: John 10:27, James 1:22, Mark 9:7, 1 Samuel 3:9 and Proverbs 12:15.





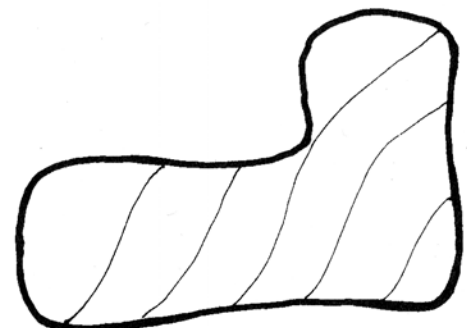
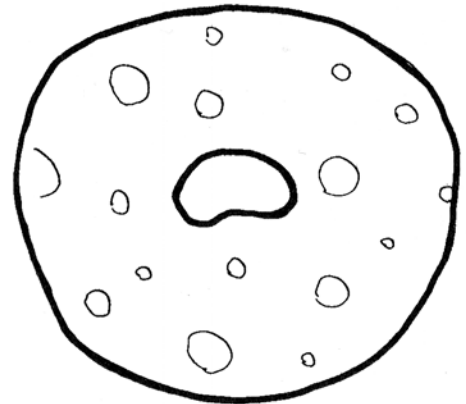
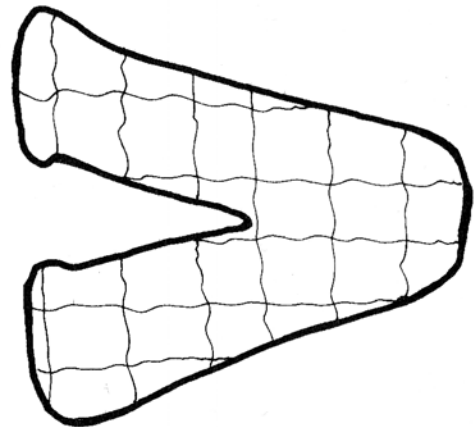
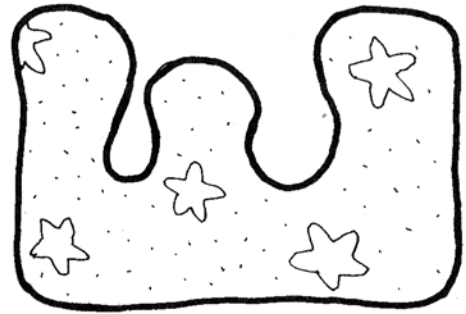


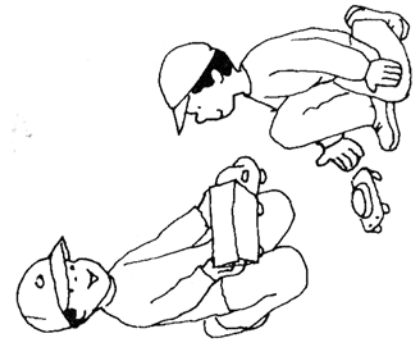
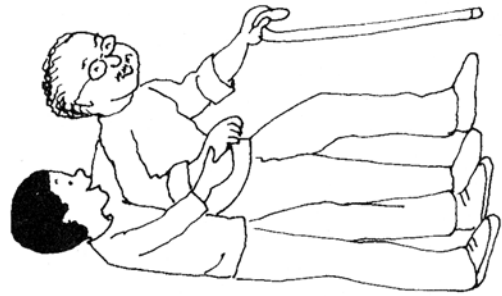
Craft 4

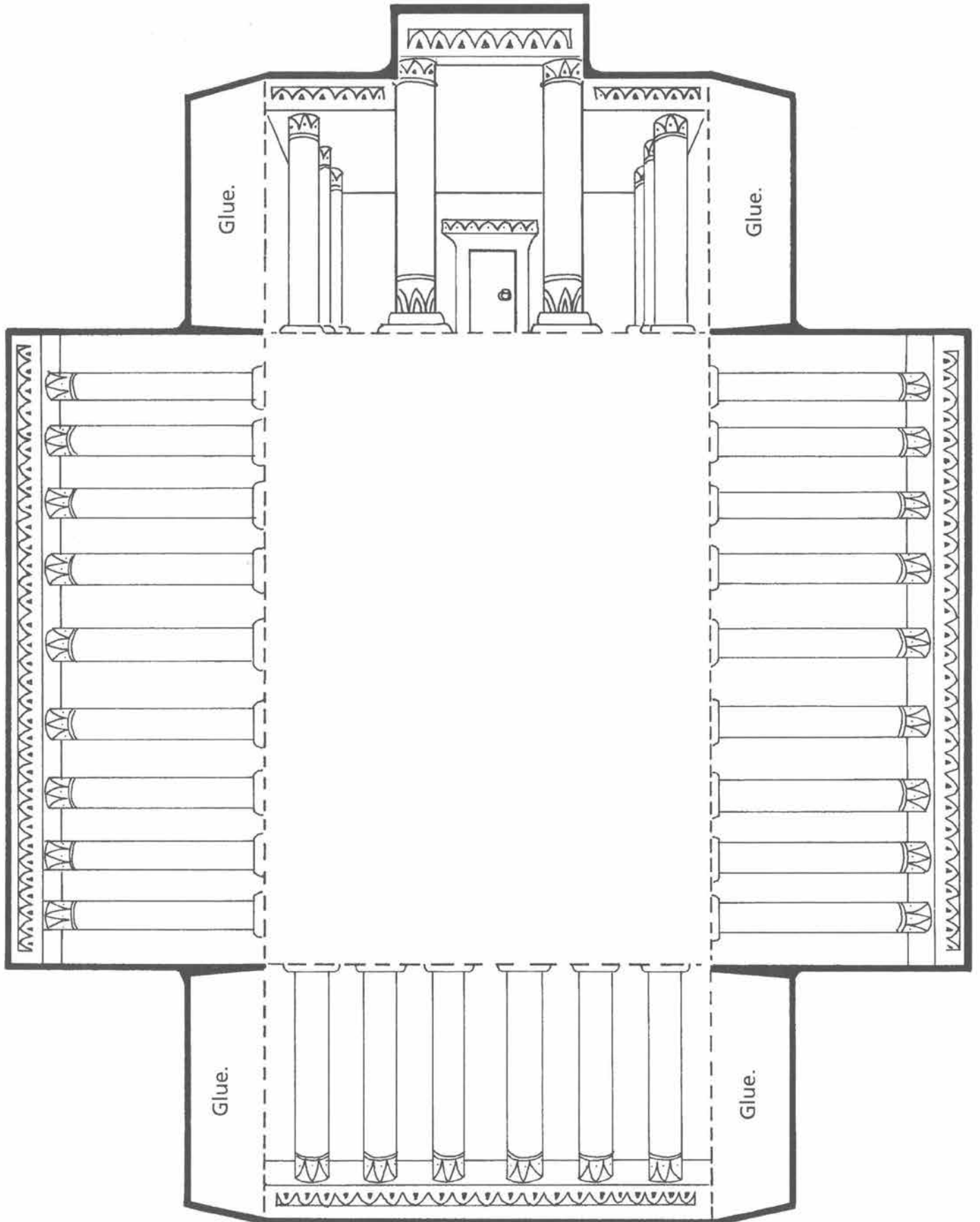
Enrichment suggestions:

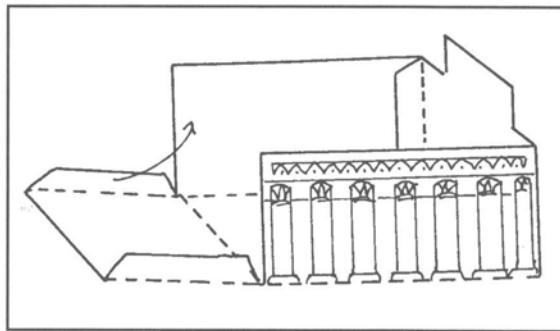
The Students may decorate the letters with glitter.

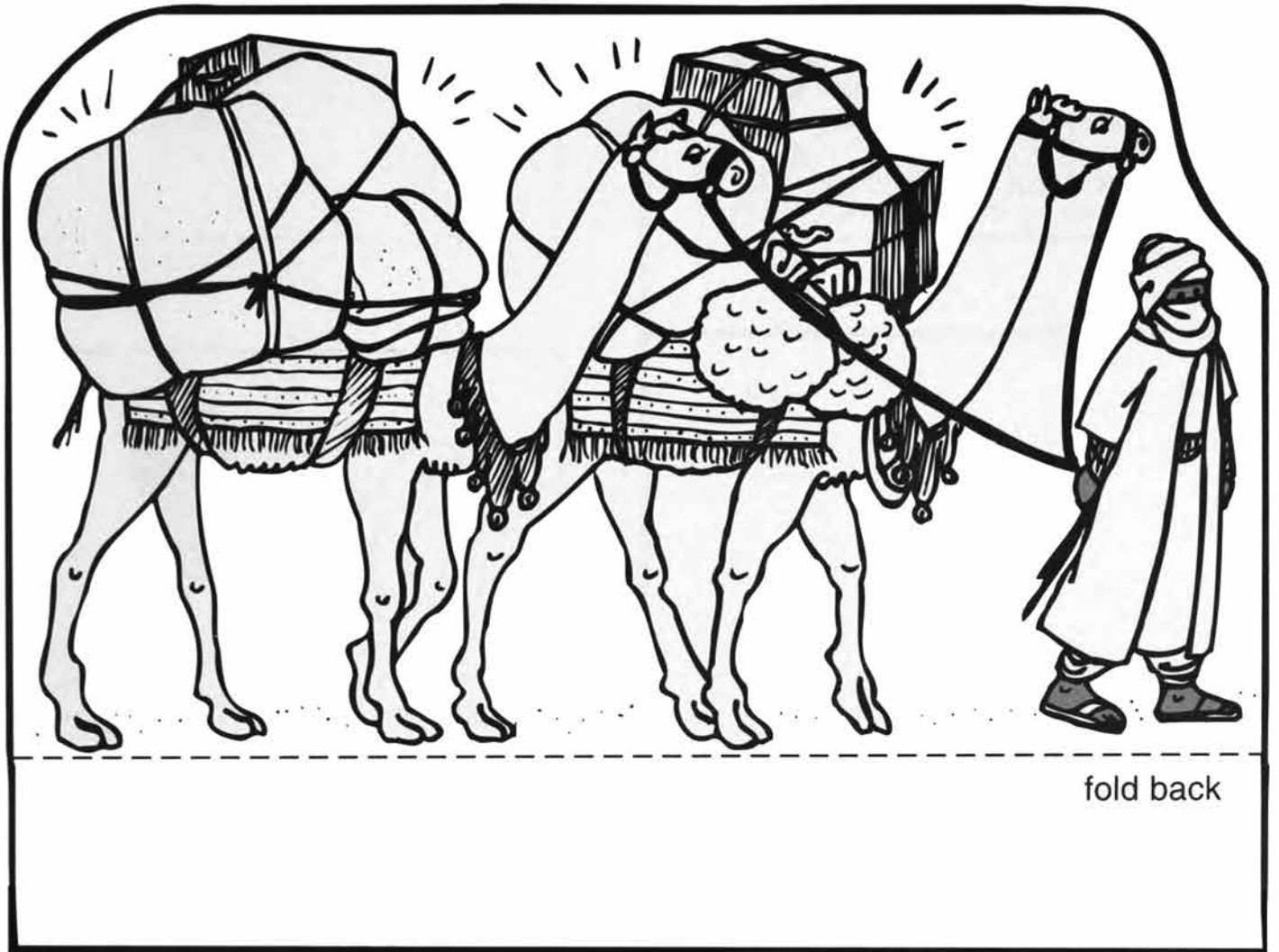
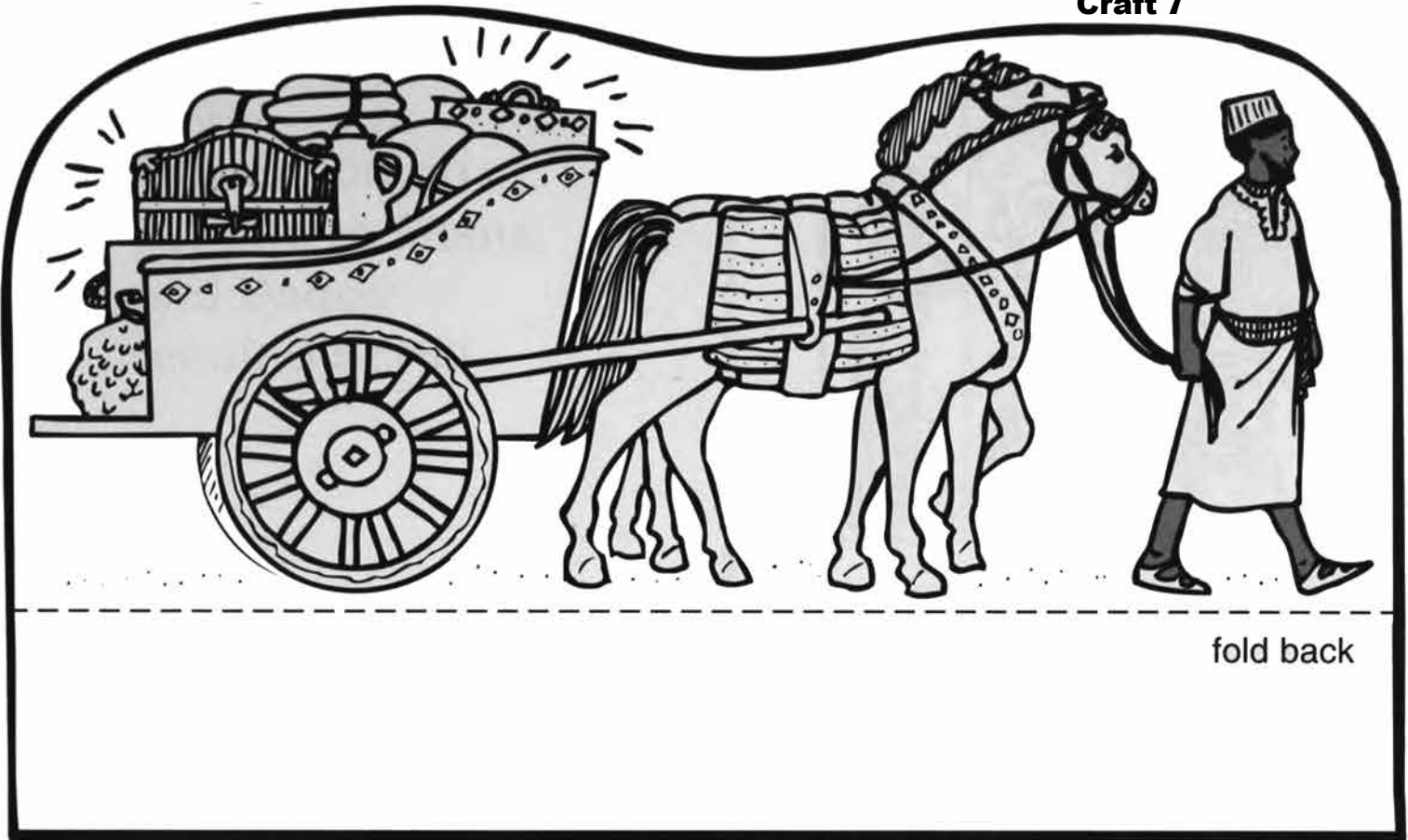


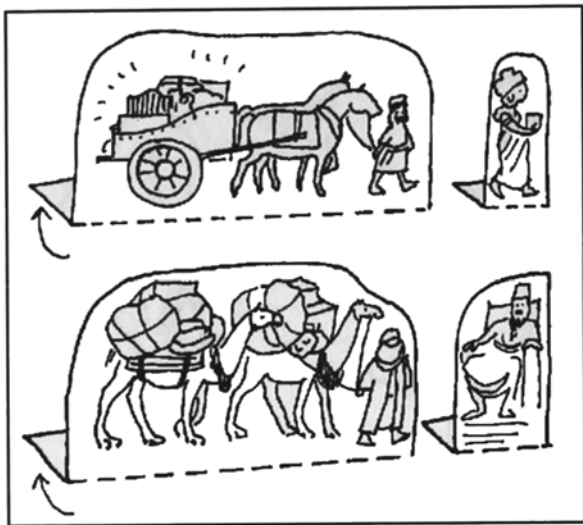
Craft 6

Build a temple. Tear out the activity sheet. Color the temple and cut around on all the heavy lines. Fold back on the dotted lines, Glue on the spaces indicated to form an empty box—the temple.

Enrichment suggestions:

Glue the temple to some construction paper before cutting it out to hide the directions. Cut out the temple after it is glued to the construction paper. Draw some candlesticks inside the temple.

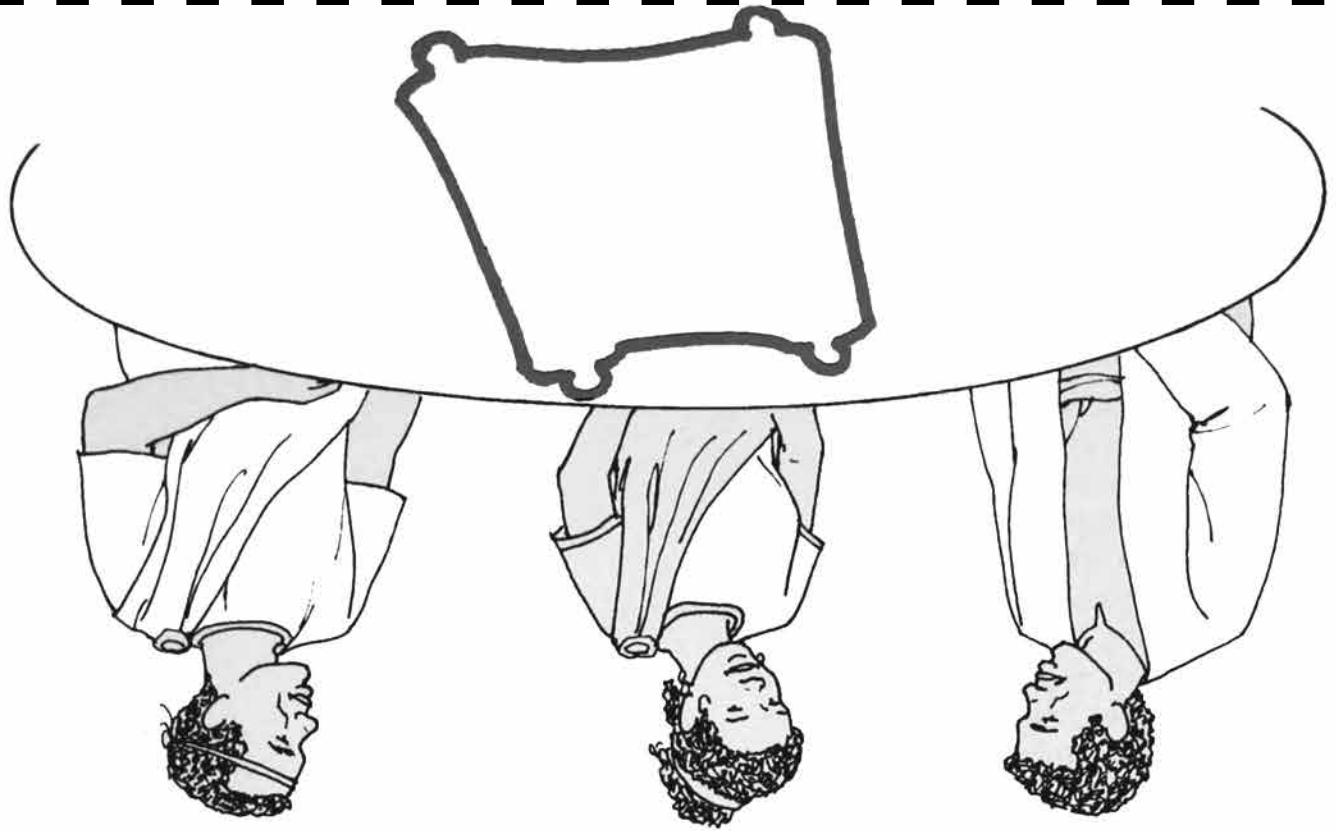




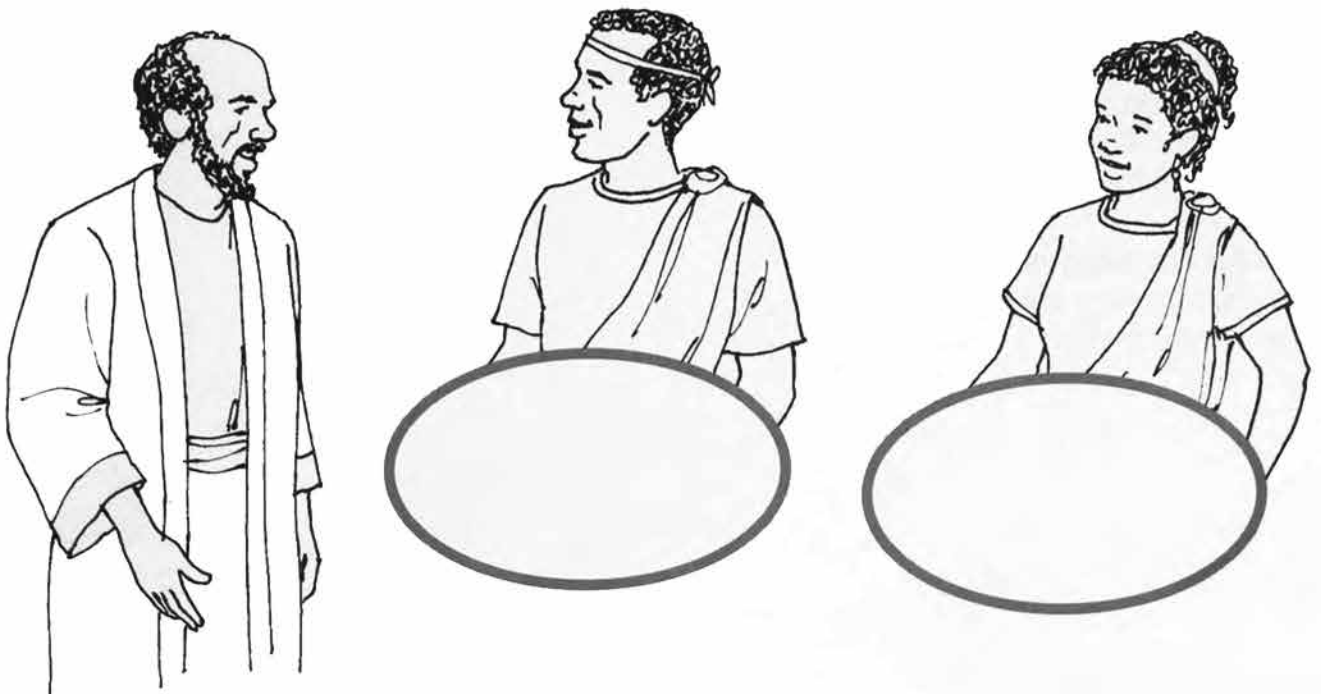
Make the Queen of Sheba's caravan. The lesson page contains stand-up figures for the caravan, and the back cover has the Queen of Sheba ready to approach King Solomon on his throne. After the children have colored the figures on the lesson page, they may cut them out along with the figures from the back cover and fold all of them back on the dotted line. Then the children are ready to act out the parade of the caravan and the visit of the Queen of Sheba with King Solomon.

Enrichment suggestions:

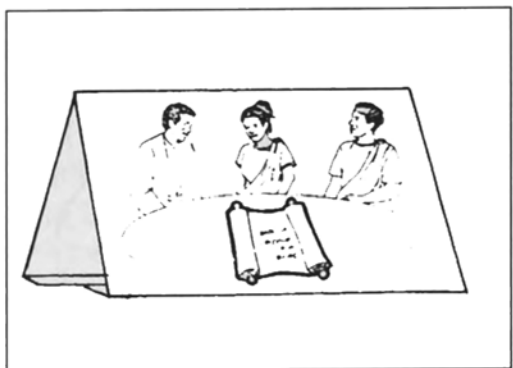
Use glitter to make the royalty and caravan reflect the richness.



How did Priscilla and Aquila serve Apollos in love?



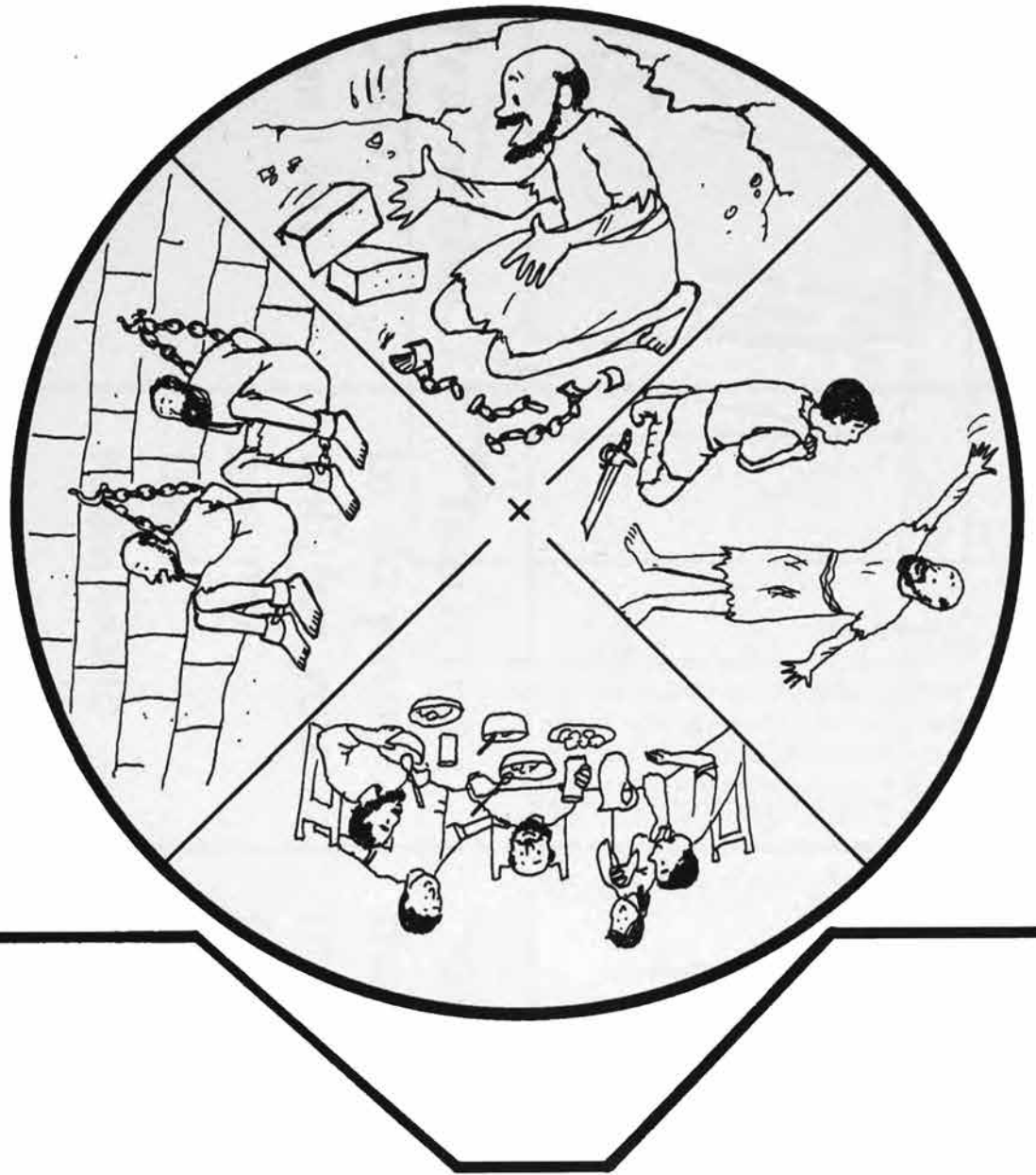
How did Priscilla and Aquila serve Paul in love?

**Craft 8:**

Make a stand-up picture. Cut off the lesson number strip and the three colorful pictures from the back cover: beverages, food, and scroll. Fold on the dotted lines and show the children how the picture stands up. Turn the picture of Priscilla and Aquila with Paul toward the children. Ask the question at the bottom. "Which of the things that we cut off the back should go on this picture? Yes, the beverages and the food. Let's glue them on the right places." Turn the craft so that the picture of Priscilla and Aquila with Apollos is showing. Ask the question at the bottom. "What do you think we should do to this picture? Yes, let's glue on the scroll."

Enrichment suggestions:

The children may color the picture if they desire.

Craft 9:

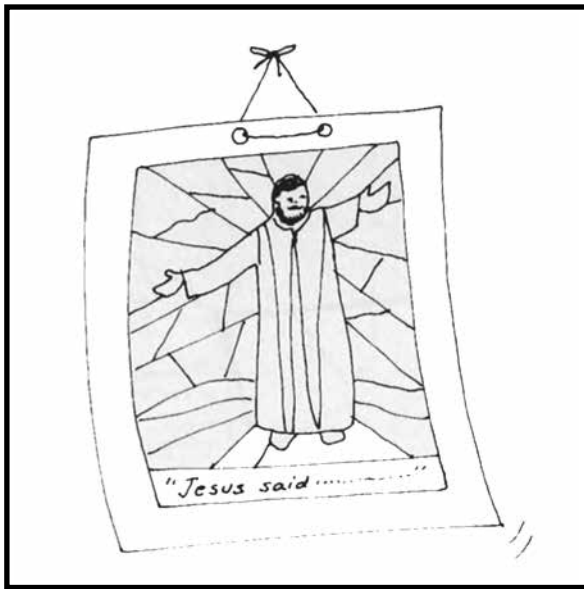
Make a story wheel that shows Paul and Silas and their adventure. Let children cut out the two pieces from the activity page. Lay the verse piece on top of the circle matching up the **x**. Poke a paper fastener through both pieces at the **x**. Now turn the circle to show story progression. (1) Paul and Silas in jail, (2) earthquake, (3) jailer asking to be saved (4) Paul and Silas at jailer's home.

Enrichment suggestions:

Children may decorate the verse side of the story wheel with star stickers or music notes.

Craft 10:

Make a stain glass picture. Young children may color creatively. Glue the activity page onto a sheet of colored construction paper. Punch two holes in the top edge and tie an 18" length of yarn through to hang it.

Enrichment suggestions:

Older children may color the sections of the picture according to this code:

x = blue o = orange + = green
y = yellow p = purple · = brown
